

Horticulture Rules

- 1. All classes are open to any amateur grower.
- 2. All Horticulture entries must have been grown by the exhibitor. Potted plants must be owned for 90 days prior to the show.
- 3. Containers of clear glass / plastic must be used for cut specimens. Stems of the exhibit must be visible with no foliage below the water line.
- 4. Labeled horticulture specimens will be given preference in judging.
- 5. Container grown plants may be double potted.
- 6. One blue ribbon will be given per class, if merited.
- 7. A specimen is one plant, one bloom, one spike, or one spray.

Awards

- 1. Ribbons will be given for 1st place (blue), 2nd place (red), 3rd place (white), and Honorable Mention (yellow) in each class.
 - 2. Best in Show will be given for Best Overall Horticulture exhibit.
